

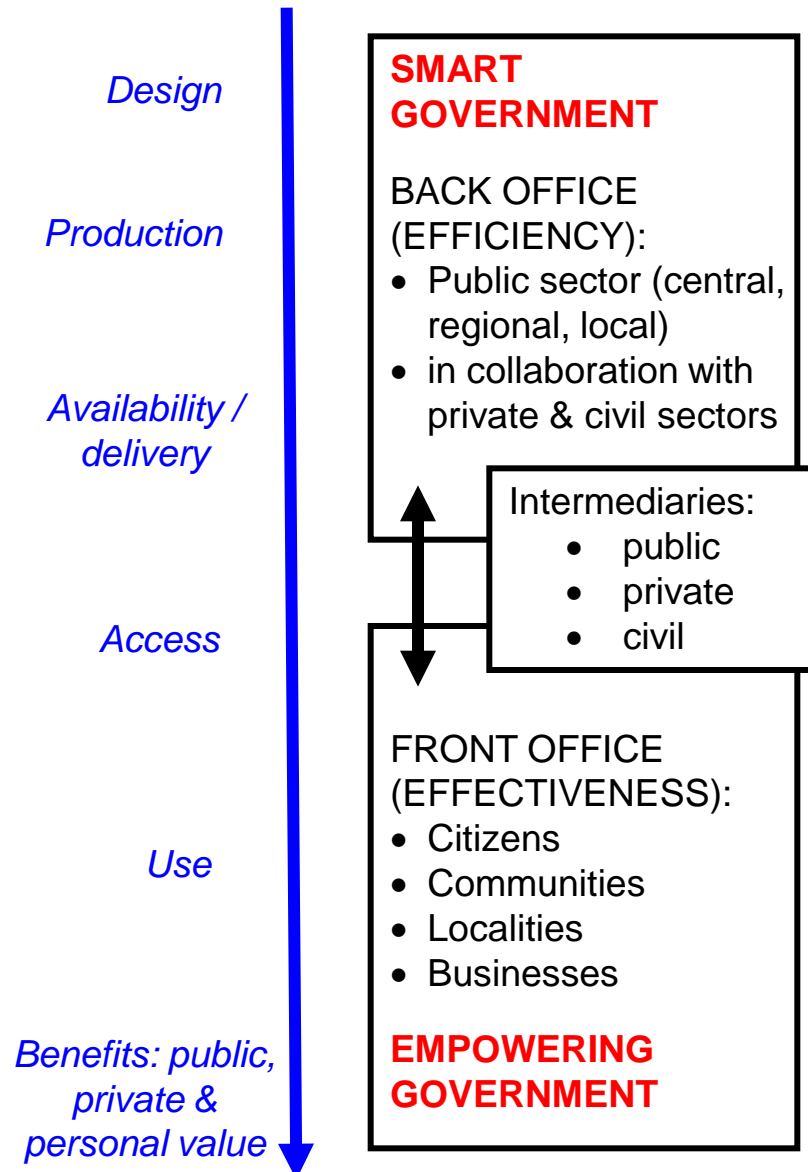

# ICT is making the value open and porous

## Open governance will be porous:

- **turning government inside-out:**
  - exposure of inside of government (transparency, openness, accountability)
  - e.g. civil servants and politicians out on the streets
- **turning government outside-in:**
  - letting in private & civil sectors (PPPs, PCPs)
  - letting in users (e.g. to design policy, make decisions, as ‘co-creators’ of services)

## Open governance will be fluid and flexible....BUT also

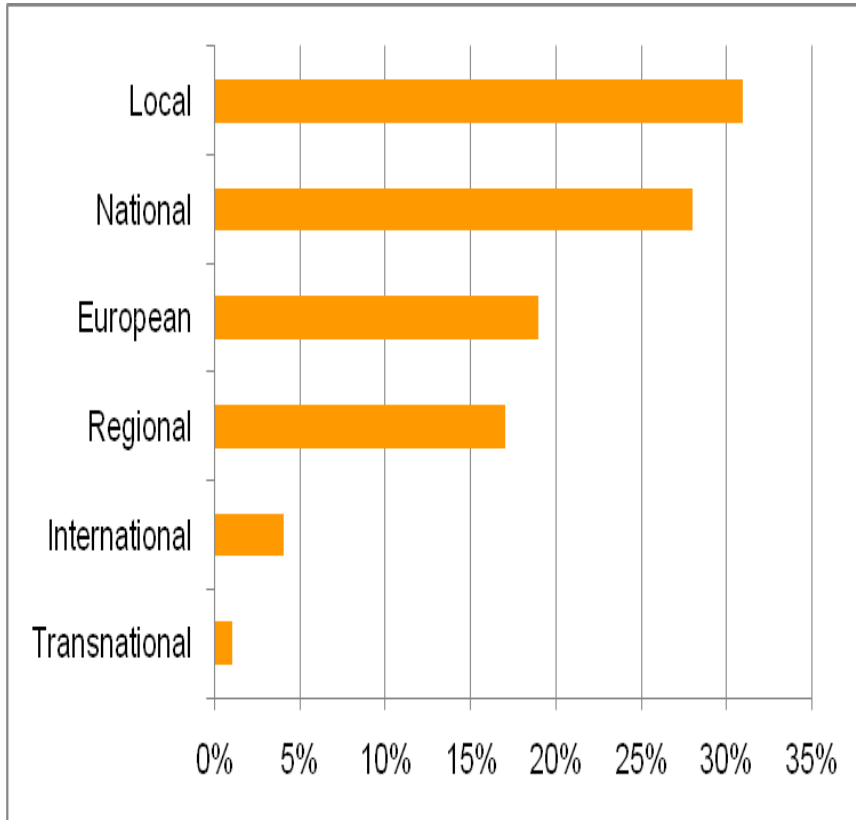
- is the ONLY truly democratic and participative actor
- must serve everybody
- must be inclusive
- must provide (a minimum of) stability and continuity
- must be trustworthy AND be seen to be trustworthy

# eParticipation and eEngagement in Europe

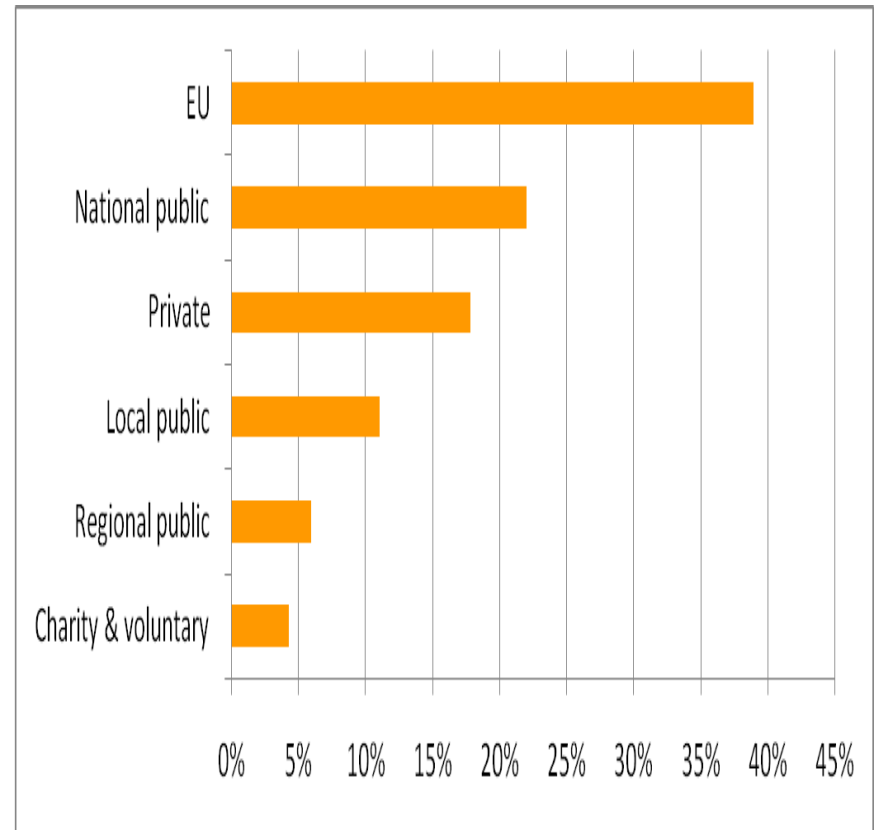
- Concerns about 'democratic deficit', falling participation in elections, falling membership of political parties
- There is huge growth in eParticipation & eEngagement BUT government is lagging
- Most citizens are not interested in the institutions or the mechanics but are interested in policy issues that effect them
- Ultimately represents a power shift:
  - is government ready?
  - are citizens ready?
  - what is the future role and mandate of the public sector?
