



### Marseilles' Second Chance

#### Build on historical premises

- With a surface of 45.000 m<sup>2</sup> and 10.000 m<sup>2</sup> of floors
- A computer network using optical fibre with a rate of 4 Gb/s
- 200 computers 5 servers, and a station of video assembly
- 1 line for Internet access, and 1 dedicated to broadcasting

### Marseilles' Second Chance : busy place

 Marseilles' Second Chance receives more than 300 students a year

- More than 1300 young adults were trained
- A rate of "success" which rise up to 61 %
- mainly with permanent employment
- or by going back to the traditional school or training system

Context: fighting exclusion with education and training

### Origin of Second Chance School

Initiated by Edith Cresson, former EU Commissioner, in the White Paper on education "Teaching and Learning: Towards the Learning Society", which was adopted by the European Commission in November 1995 and by all Education Ministries of the 15 member states of the European Union.

### Objective

Integrate back to society, through education and training, young people between the age of 18-25, without a diploma or formal qualifications and who have been out of the national school system for at least one year.

### An experimental answer : the Second Chance School of Marseille

- Supported since 1995 by Mister Jean-Claude Gaudin, Marseilles' Mayor
- Supported by local financially institutions: PACA regional council, General Council 13, Community of Municipalities Marseille Provence Métropole and Marseille Provence chamber of commerce and industry.

### European pilot project, Marseilles' Second Chance School was inaugurated in 1997



**Objectives of EDA-E2C** 

# Problem

- Each year in Marseilles, 4 000 / 4500 young people drop out of the national school system without any diploma or formal qualification
- The objective of the EDA-E2C project
- To develop a system mixing classroom and distance learning for 1000 to 1500 young people a year
- To respect the specificities of the SCS approach
  - Individualized pedagogy
  - Partnership with businesses
- Developping Social skills actions
- To obtain an operating unitarian cost lower than the average French school costs.
