- Webcasting of City/County Meetings
- Communications with Local Leaders
- Links to other key sites (airport, transportation, hotels)

 - View Streaming video of Past Meetings



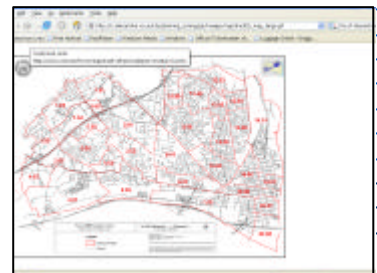
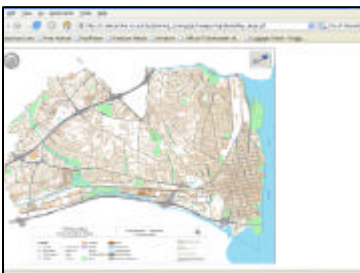
E-Government Benefits

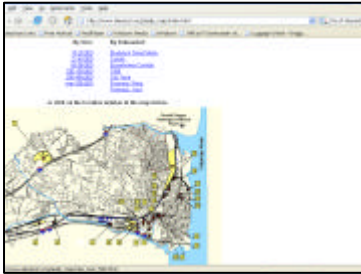
1. Always Open (24 Hour City Hall)
