What is TeleCities

A network of CITIES FOR CITIES


Born out of the Eurocities network, it represents:

- a forum for **city experts** who are primarily concerned with the implementation of telematics to conduct city business and deliver city services, backed by a political mandate
- a forum of **good practice** where problems, successes and failures can be shared and informed solutions sought



What is TeleCities

- a platform for the **exchange and dissemination** of information relating to projects and programs for **funding**
- a source of **partners** for projects
- a **lobbying structure** towards the European institutions, such as the Commission and the Parliament, acting as the ICT representative of the Cities



TeleCities Activities

- **Platform for cities to network**
 - Technical cooperation
 - Partnership building
- **Lobbying**
 - Local needs and local projects
 - Policy input with Policy papers produced in different fields: e-democracy, e-education and employability

- "Exchange of Skills" – LEONARDO programme**
local job creation and the development of new job opportunities with local communities, through the promotion of capacity building with the social economy sector.
- "eCT – electronic calls for tenders" – eCONTENT programme**
Investigation of possible public-private partnerships to facilitate access to, and re-use of, data embedded into public works calls for tender. State-of-the-art survey, statistics and trends will be available for the construction industry in order to understand how the demand from PA is evolving

What is needed

- Developing policies and actions targeting those people and **groups** who don't manage to be involved
- When setting up an e-strategy, they will want to look at what are the issues and needs expressed by those different groups in the Community.
- Finding ways to **make it easier** for ALL citizens to access public services that are ICT provided
- Guarantee IT **skills** and knowledge **training** for ALL

What is needed

- ICT alone is not going to solve the problem of exclusion: **labour market** reintegration policies maybe a better way
- For instance developing innovative strategies of intervention on the ICT labour market system by:
 - promoting strong partnership in the ICT Industries community
 - develop a systemic approach of intervention
 - transfer the Model to other sectors: bank, electronic industries, tourism, etc

- It creates a platform for cities to exchange experiences and ideas in this field
- It can contribute to benchmarking exercises, to identify the models to be disseminated
