What is **E-Government**?

- Using new communications media to:
 - Publish broader access to government information
 - Interact -broader public involvement in participatory government
 - Transact broader availability of government services
 - Goals:

- Wider reach
- Accountability
- Efficiency & Cost Savings
- Citizen Participation

What is E-Democracy?

- Using new communications media to:
 - Allow individuals and organizations to better engage in advocacy and civil society
 - Provide greater openness and accountability for traditional governance structures
- Ensuring that in the future networked society and economy civil liberties, civil rights, and human rights are protected
 Goal: A better democracy

E-Government, E-Democracy or Both?

Does the distinction matter?

- Governments should be able to define goals and understand impact on citizen participation and efficiency
- E-democracy doesn't necessarily include traditional government structures
 - NGOs, industry, new governance bodies

Advocacy and Civil Society

- Interactive and abundant nature of ICT allows:
 - Better use of source material and selfeducation
 - Tools for direct and personalized contact and deliberation

 NGOs are serving as agent to help individuals interact with traditional power structures

A New Kind of Civil Protest:

10:00am April 22 through 2:00am April 24, The Fair4All Net.Jam '99 will go on-line. Forty of the country's most prominent DJ's and promoters will participate in a 40-hour non-stop anti-monopoly marathon - broadcast in Live Audio over the internet to listeners on the Web. During the media festival, individuals and organizations around the world will be urged to show their support for SPT's unfair business practices and disregard for it's customers - by placing anti-monopoly icons on their sites while linking to http://fair4all.terminal.cz. There, webmasters can stream live music and video for free on their own homepages from the Fair4All Net Jam. Discussion groups, email links and anti-monopoly news will be also be available on the web site.

The action is aiming to gather the maximum possible amount of public support- keeping the debate in the media spotlight and keeping the pressure on SPT Telecom.

Principle Aims of the Action:

- To campaign for an improvement in the telecommunications infrastructure of the Czech Republic.
- To protest against SPT Telecom for repressing the growth of internet in the Czech Republic.
- To recognize and highlight the potential of the internet as an affordable and effective mode of communication and a flourishing cultural medium.
- To launch a Citizen's Manifesto- laying out what kind of service the paying customers want and expect.

Democratic Values in the Digital Age

- User Controlled, Open,
 Abundant and Decentralized
 Nature of the Internet means that everyone is a publisher.
- NGOs, industry and governments should work together to build Internet to its full democratic potential.
- However, societies and economies based on new technologies will face new challenges.

Greater Openness and Accountability

- Democracies need to get information on the workings of government to the citizen in order to survive
- Open, Abundant and Global nature of the Internet means:
 - Many traditional barriers to providing information about the workings of government do not exist
 - Serving a wider range of constituents
 - Individuals do not necessarily need to come to town hall to attend a meeting
