Thinking on eGovernment: Fairy Tale approach

- All European regions, including those from the NMS, are reshaping social INTERACTIONS, using the best from eGOV projects.
- All regions understand "ECONOMICS" of eGovernment (ROI versus Public Value of eGOV projects) and use Meta-knowledge in pan-European PA

Regional Experiences & Barriers

- In NMS development of ICT is going faster, than organizational changes. Regions need innovation in eGovernment both in technical and social terms
- Lack of multidisciplinary (political, social and cultural) analyses of the new Democracies & eGovernance.
- Re-focusing of eGovernment: ICT should reinforce citizen engagement and democracy (ePARTICIPATION). New models to develop the ICT supported reengineering of social INTERACTIONS are needed.
- No enough knowledge for measurement of economics of eGOV projects, for creating balance between ROI (Return of Investments) and Public Value of eGOV projects.
- National Public Administrations and politicians need to stimulate a political will for changes and management skills - Regions are often going faster!!!

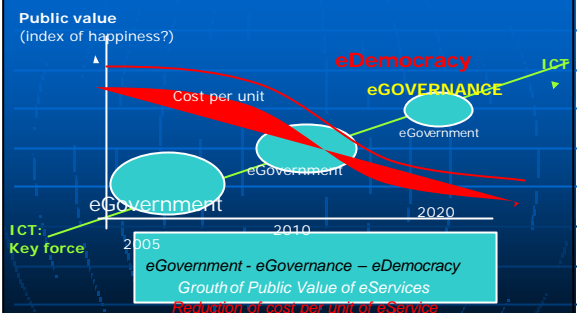
