

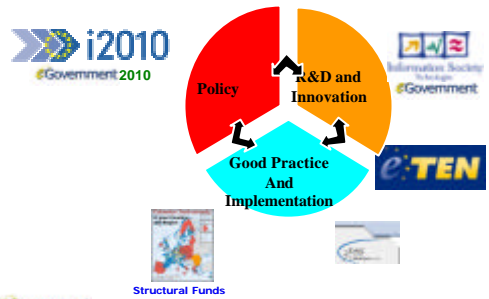

eGovernment is part of i2010



- A Single European Information Space
 - The completion of a **Single European Information Space** which promotes an open and competitive internal market for information society and media;
- Innovation and investment in research
 - Strengthening **Innovation and Investment** in ICT research to promote growth and more and better jobs;
- Inclusion, better public services, quality of life
 - Achieving an **Inclusive European Information Society** that promotes growth and jobs consistent with sustainable development and prioritizing better public services and quality of life.

eGovernment in 2005-2006



- i2010 eGovernment Action Plan (Spring 2006), Ministerial Declaration, Ministerial Conference Manchester, 24-25 Nov:
 - Beyond online availability: delivering major and measurable benefits: focused objectives
 - What are the objectives for key enablers such as eID in public services across borders
 - In which applications and services can we make significant impact and deliver benefits
 - Contribution to efficiency and effectiveness – cutting red tape, more user satisfaction
 - What should we achieve in inclusive eGovernment for all citizens and businesses
- R&D: launch of new EU projects and preparation of the future programme (FP7)
 - eParticipation, personalised/inclusive services, pro-active knowledge-based transformation, secure eGovernment and eGovernment to strengthen enlargement
 - ≈ 60 M€ funding, 23 new projects
- New pilots and validation in eTEN: IDabc new projects and studies: eCommission
