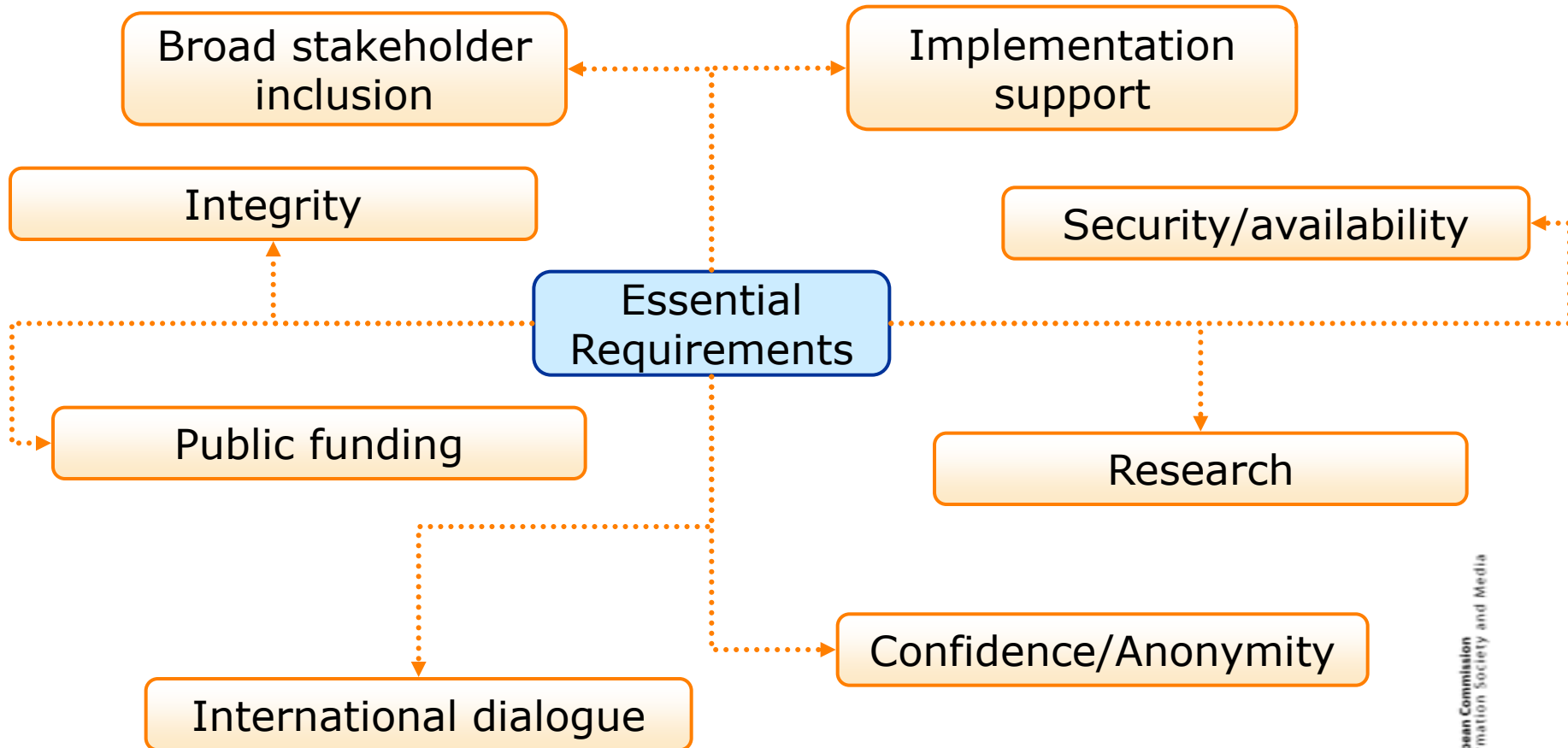

Next Steps for Europe

- Confirm commitment to an open IoT with a shared, neutral and independent governance.
- Learn from the current experience of GS1 France/Orange.
- Launch a public debate between private and public stakeholders.
- Assess existing and potential alternatives regarding IoT architecture and coding.
- Work out a Standards Mandate to ESOs.
- Analyse the implications of IPv6 for future IoT architectures.
