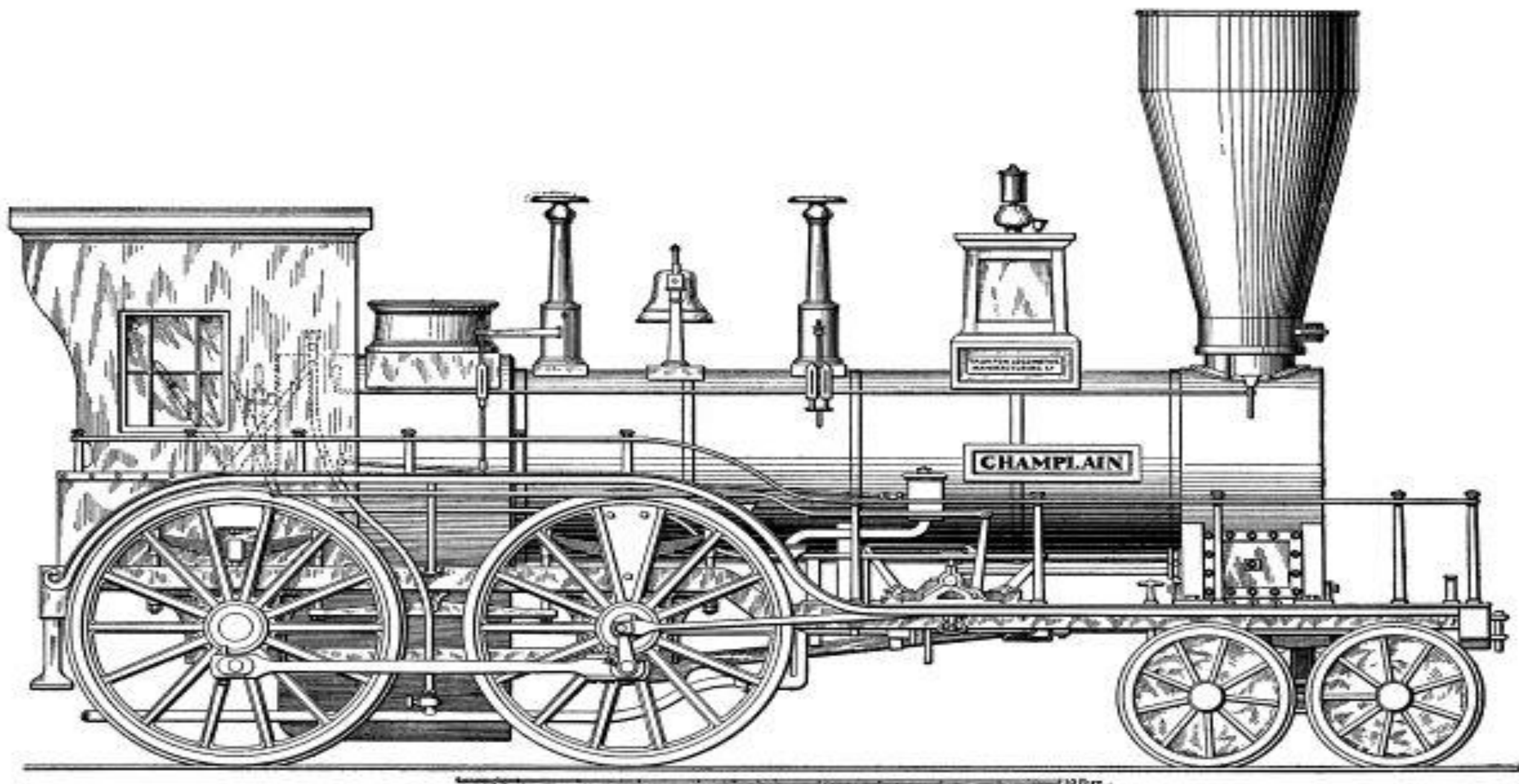


FIG. 17.—EXPRESS ENGINE, HUDSON RIVER RAILROAD, 1849—AN ORIGINAL NEW YORK CENTRAL FLIER.

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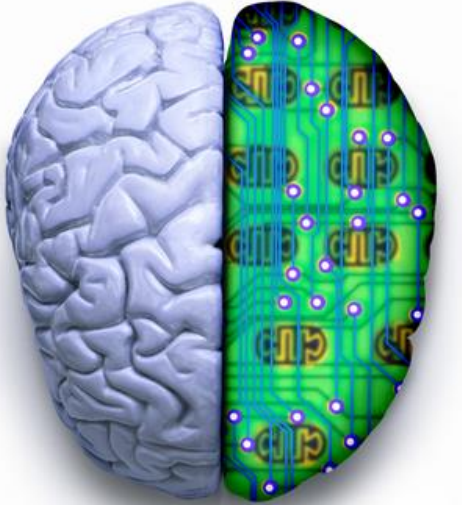

I. **The Imitation Game.**

I propose to consider the question, 'Can machines think?' This should begin with definitions of the meaning of the terms 'machine' and 'think'. The definitions might be framed so as to reflect so far as possible the normal use of the words, but this attitude is dangerous. If the meaning of the words 'machine' and 'think' are to be found by examining how they are commonly used it is difficult to escape the conclusion that the meaning and the answer to the question, 'Can machines think?' is to be sought in a statistical survey such as a Gallup poll. But this is absurd. Instead of attempting such a definition I shall replace the question by another, which is closely related to it and is expressed in relatively unambiguous words.

Anonymous recently set up a petition on the White House's [We the People](#) Web site asking the Obama administration to make distributed denial of service (DDoS) attacks a "legal form of protesting," similar to the Occupy protests.


"With the advance in internet technology, comes new grounds for protesting," the [petition](#) states. "Distributed denial-of-service (DDoS), is not any form of hacking in any way. It is the equivalent of repeatedly hitting the refresh button on a webpage. It is, in that way, no different than any 'occupy' protest. Instead of a group of people standing outside a building to occupy the area, they are having their computer occupy a website to slow (or deny) service of that particular website for a short time."

"The petition goes on to demand that anyone who has been jailed for participating in a DDoS attack should be immediately released -- a nice touch -- and that anything related to the attack should be expunged from their criminal records," writes [The Register's Neil McAllister](#). "DDoS attacks are indeed one of the go-to methods used when Anonymous wants to make a point. The group used the technique to [take down UK government websites](#) in August in protest of the treatment of WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange, [and again in November](#) in retaliation for Israel's bombing of sites in Gaza."

The petition, which was posted on January 7, has thus far only received just over 1,000 signatures. If the petition gets more than 25,000 signatures by February 7, it will receive an official response from the White House.

Crypto Wars

The **Crypto wars** is an unofficial name for the **U.S.** government's attempts to limit the public's and foreign nations' access to **cryptography** strong enough to resist decryption by national intelligence agencies (especially USA's **NSA**).^[2]

The crypto wars was at one point around 2005 pronounced "won" by the public's legal access to encryption.^[3] Subsequently, **Snowden's 2013 leak** of the NSA **Bullrun program** to secretly weaken encryption algorithms and implementations have made the winner of the crypto wars less clear, and have intensified the debate about the public's need for encryption.^[4] The new push for strong encryption in response to the NSA revelations, notably Apple's iPhone encryption, have in turn led the US government to renew calls for limits in the public's access to non-backdoored encryption, to the surprise^[dubious – discuss] of many privacy advocates who thought the fight for the public's legal right to strong encryption was already conclusively won.

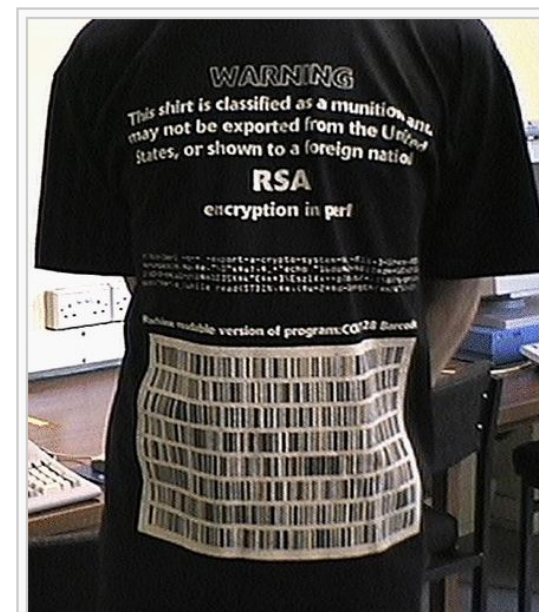
