80-90% of people want to live better and longer at home

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A dilemma to solve

1/2 over the age of retirement are not receiving **any pension** (International Labor Organization) (h

5-7% > 65 years are in institutions (hospitals, elderly homes, living facilities....) -> Cost: 1,5 x the annual GDP per capita

(e.g. 44 000 € per person in France)

Help services are used by 5-17% of the population -> Cost: 10 to 50% of per capita income

e.g. 1/10 French is able to finance the loss of autonomy of his parents

48 % of caregivers report chronic illness



1/3 caregivers die before the helped person

75% of caregivers feel stressed or overworked

226 km of average distance between the caregivers and the helped person (in France)
