

Destruction of Amur falcons

- 120,000–140,000 Amur falcons were being hunted and killed in Nagaland, India, every year.
- One of the longest migrations among all birds—a staggering 22,000 km annually. From China and to Northeast India and Bangladesh and eventually over the Indian Ocean to reach Africa: a 2-3 day non-stop flight covering over 3,000 km over the sea.
